Iconic plane lands in town

AN iconic plane from the Second World War has set up home in Knutsford.

Thanks to Knutsford-based business Oliver Valves, the replica plane will sit in the company's hangar on the Parkfield Industrial Estate.

Owner Michael Oliver bought the plane from the Royal British Legion but said it will be used by the organisation when it holds fundraising events.

The replica represents an aircraft which was flown over France, in October 1941, in an attempt to protect Blenheim bombers attacking port installations.
